**PLACEMENT OF DOCKS, BOAT HOISTS AT
TOWNSHIP PARKS**

Ord. No. 15

Adopted: June 5, 1986

77.000

An ordinance to secure the public health, safety and general welfare of persons and property by regulating the placement of docks and other items of personal property at Township Parks.

THE TOWNSHIP OF LYON, ROSCOMMON COUNTY, MICHIGAN, HEREBY ORDAINS:

77.001 Placement or storing dock, boat hoist.

Sec. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or association of persons to place, install or store at any township park or on any portion thereof, a dock, boat hoist or other similar items of personal property.

77.002 Penalties.

Sec. 2. The sanction for a violation which is a municipal civil infraction shall be a civil fine in the amount as provided by this Ordinance or any ordinance, plus any costs, damages, expenses and other sanctions, as authorized under Chapter 87 of Act No. 236 of the Public Acts of 1961, as amended, and other applicable laws.

- (1) Unless otherwise specifically provided for a particular municipal civil infraction violation by this code or any ordinance, the civil fine for a violation shall be not less than \$50.00, plus costs and other sanctions.
 - (2) Second violation within a 3 year period* \$125.00
 - (3) Third violation within a 3 year period* \$250.00
 - (4) Fourth or subsequent violation within a 3 year period* \$400.00
- (determined on the basis of the date of the violation(s))*

In addition to the above-prescribed civil fines, costs in the amount of \$10.00 shall be assessed by the bureau if the fine and costs are paid within 10 days of the date of service of the municipal ordinance violation notice. Otherwise, costs of \$20 shall be assessed by the bureau.

In addition any violation of this ordinance is hereby declared to be a public nuisance per se which may be abated in Circuit Court in lieu of or in addition to other civil sanctions.

77.003 Effective date; repeal.

Sec. 3. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty days after publication, and original Ordinance 15 shall be automatically repealed.
